

INSTRUCTIONS FOR LETTER TO EWEB RE: No Digital Computerized Smart Meter (Rev. 12.3.18)

Suggestion from FamiliesForSAFEMeters.org (Or contact an attorney. Also, Ratepayer-Owners covered by Americans for Disability Act ADA may consider writing a different letter stating that you should not have to pay OPT OUT fees in the future.)

1-This letter can be used to notify EWEB that you choose to keep your analog meter instead of having a wireless digital smart meter installed. (Customers from other utilities can re-write letter.)

2- Make a copy of this letter: sign and date both letters. One copy will be your receipt from EWEB. (Letter also at FamiliesforSAFEMeters.org).

3- Be sure to include your name and address in the 'From' section of letter top; state that you are the utility bill payer. Tenants paying EWEB bill also have the right to demand no digital meter.

4- Bring both letters to a bill payment window at EWEB headquarters (where bills are paid).

5- Hand in the letter and copy and ask clerk to stamp both with a 'received' and 'date' stamp. If s/he unwilling, ask for a supervisor, but that probably will not be necessary. Others have succeeded.

6- Alternatively, send EWEB signed letter by certified mail: *return receipt requested*. USPS website will show when EWEB received it: take a screen shot of web page as your receipt.

FamiliesForSAFEMeters.org does not represent that this letter will prevent digital meter installs but may delay them until courts, elected reps and/or Ratepayer-Owner outrage prevent digital water, electric, (gas) meter installations due to 4th Amendment privacy, health concerns, cost increases including erroneous readings and other legitimate issues including older wiring, fires and explosions.
